Freedom, Cookies, and Egg-Casserole?

“We are not children of slavery but of freedom. It is for this very freedom that Christ set us free, so don’t you dare willingly put back on the burden of slavery.” - Galatians 4:31 to 5:1

Over the last few months I have been engaged in several conversations about Calvary’s fellowship time after worship every Sunday. Many of these conversations have been filled with thanksgiving and praise for this time when we gather with our sisters and brothers to share conversation, to grown closer together in our relationships, and to live fully into the Joy of our salvation. Fellowship time is a treasure at Calvary and in many ways it was the reinventing and the reinvestment in this simple time of gathering that helped form Calvary into the congregation it is today.

As I understand it, Calvary’s fellowship time was not always what it is today. For most of Calvary’s 50+ year history there either was no fellowship time, or it was a brief time after worship where a handful of people grabbed a quick cup of coffee and stood around for a few minutes chatting while the majority of the congregation went its way. I have heard that in the years when the congregation was in the midst of its deepest turmoil that many folks at Calvary really had a hard time being in the same room with one another and so even this simple chat with a cup of coffee dissolved into almost nothing. It was a season in Calvary’s history marked with lots of judgmentalism, fear, resentment, and shame

Fast forward almost two years and the congregation had experience the pain of a gut-wrenching congregational divorce. About a third of the congregation had left Calvary to form a new congregation, while a second third of the congregation had stopped attending Calvary and were either worshipping somewhere else or had given-up on church all together. The folks who were still at here were deeply committed but when they looked around there was a realization that they really didn’t know each other all that well... I’m not sure who initially had the Holy Spirit inspired insight, but it was in the midst of this reality that a group of women decided that if the members of the congregation were going to have meaningful relationships with one another they should spend time sitting down together and talking while sharing some food. Calvary’s fellowship time was born and God has been using it to build relationships and to build the congregation ever since. As someone who came to the congregation well after this transition had taken place I very much believe that if it had not been for Calvary’s fellowship time, there is a high likelihood that Calvary the congregation would not have survived.



Here we are nearly five years later and the congregation is growing. More than a third of the congregation has no first-hand memory of when things were really rough here, and our fellowship time has grown in such a way that on some Sundays we literally run out of space at the tables around the fellowship hall. Over the years the quantity and the quality of the food that people contribute to our fellowship time has gradually increased as well. What started out as opening a couple packages of cookies now often resembles a first class breakfast buffet. It is at this point that the very thing which God used to help rescue Calvary out of the depths has become, for some, a burden.

While many of my conversations about our Fellowship Time have focused on praising its virtues, I have also had a growing number of conversations with people who feel overwhelmed at the prospect of helping provide food for fellowship when their turn comes up. It is in the nature of human beings to take the life-giving gifts of God and transform them into burdensome laws that build barriers of guilt, shame, resentment and fear between God’s people. I believe this is starting to happen with our fellowship time.

Here is a simple diagnostic test you can use with yourself, answer the following questions with a simple yes or no:

1. When your turn to help host fellowship time is approaching do you ever feel a sense of trepidation because you’re not sure you can bring something that measures-up?

2. When you leave worship and enter the fellowship hall do you ever look at the table of food and think about what you would bring to fellowship time rather than just receiving the food presented as a gracious gift?
3. Do you ever choose to bring something less elaborate for fellowship time because you are afraid that if you bring what you would really like to bring that it would put pressure on other people to “keep-up” with you?
4. Have you ever felt like the cost of contributing to fellowship time was more than you could afford?
5. Do you ever feel a particular sense of pride that your contributions are for fellowship time are the among the best?

If you answered yes to more than one of these questions I believe Fellowship Time has become a law to you rather than a life giving gift from God. It is my sense that if we are to reclaim our fellowship time, as the gift from God that was given to us to bring life, then we must reject the idea that we need to keep-up with one another, we must reject the idea that I need to measure my contributions against those of others. We must embrace the freedom to allow ourselves to bring to fellowship time what we feel blessed to bring and allow ourselves to not feel obligated to keep-up with one another.

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ⁵ For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit.

- Romans 8:1-5

In some ways it seems silly to think that Jesus died so that I can contribute whatever I feel blessed to bring to fellowship time at church. Could a simple decision between bringing Chips-Ahoy or Egg-Casserole really necessitate God’s death on my behalf? But Satan uses the very littlest and simplest thing in our lives to separate us from one another and from God. Only when we accept one another’s gifts and our own gifts as gifts from God, can we truly celebrate that I need not measure my contributions or anyone else’s. If we measure our own contributions and those of others, fellowship-time will become a law that can do nothing but hurt our congregation— but if we live into the freedom of Christ and joyously accept the contributions of others as exactly what they are, wonderful gifts directly from God, we will continue to experience the power of the Holy Spirit working in and through our fellowship time.



“Where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom.” – 2 Corinthians 3:17

So when your turn to help with fellowship comes ‘round again, Oreos and Chips-Ahoy are just fine. A breakfast casserole is just fine as well. Fresh fruit? Sure, if that’s what you are blessed to bring. The key is we cannot allow ourselves to be controlled by burdensome obligation. We must not allow ourselves to become slaves to simple thing like what we should bring to fellowship time: our freedom was bought with too high a price to be given up so easily. Bring what you feel blessed to bring, knowing that as you exercise your freedom in Christ you quite literally sticking it to the devil and contributing to a work of the Holy Spirit that has the power to make a huge impact on the future of our congregation.



What is a Purim Feast and Why is it Invading My Holy Week?

Wednesday, March 23 - 6:00 to 7:30p.m.



This year as you look at Calvary's Holy week schedule you will see something new and perhaps a little strange. The Wednesday before Easter we will be hosting a Purim Feast along with our sisters and brothers from Beth Shalom. Purim is the celebration of God's providential and miraculous saving of the Hebrew people through the courage of a young woman named Esther. The entire story is found in the Old Testament book of Esther and it reminds us that it is God's gracious will to use "ordinary" people and "ordinary" means to save us from evil.

Our feast is a whole family affair and will be highlighted by opportunities for children to dress up and help live out a dramatic reading of Esther's story. Girls are encouraged to wear princess costumes in commemoration of the good princess/queen Esther and boys are invited to dress as noble guards or knights. For those who don't have costumes some will be available. As the story is read our children will get to cheer for the heroes, boo for the bad-guys, and generally have a rowdy good time.


Sanctuary Rejuvenation Team (SRT)

The SRT has been formed and we have begun meeting to establish a list projects that we would like to see come to fruition during 2016. Our team consists of Dan English, Dick and Louise Varner, Alene Duran, Audrey McGrath, Janie Hirth, Linnea Johnston, Donann Strelec, Kristin Erickson and Linda Borders. There are many items we have identified as possible projects, among them: Pews refinished with new seating pads, improved sound system and audio/video equipment, wall décor, removal of the non-working heat registers, painting, completion of baseboard molding, communion rails stabilized, communion pads replaced, upgrade lighting and carpeting. 

News from Peace Rehabilitation Center in Nepal.

PRC, founded by Shanta Sapkota, is the first Christian trafficking organization and shelter in the country of Nepal. Since 1988, Shanta and her husband, Min, have been working to rescue and help restore young women from the horrors of sexual slavery and abuse. This is much more than a shelter; it's a family that these women become a part of. Their safe new home is filled with love and acceptance, a mother, a father, and most of all, sisters that understand, because they've been through it all themselves.

No girl is ever turned away or charged for their stay. The length of time spent in the shelter depends on each individual girl's circumstances., and with over 25 years of experience, PRC has learned that their approach to the problem of trafficking must be multi-faceted. Their work now includes border monitoring, disseminating information, counseling, education projects, and community development and outreach. At their three rehabilitation and recovery homes, they provide vocational training and income-generating projects for the girls and young women living there.

Peace Rehabilitation Center's powerful programs teach the girls not only to be survivors, but to actually become community leaders. Whether a young woman eventually returns to her village or ventures out on her own, she is well-equipped with skills to provide for herself and her family. Many of these girls have grown into "community changers," reaching out to make a difference in the lives of those around them. They are shining examples for other girls and women to see that they too can have the dream of a brighter future.

Currently living at PRC's main shelter are thirteen young women and three children. The majority of the young women living at the Peace Rehabilitation Center are trafficking victims. The three small children presently living at the shelter were either born at the shelter as a result of their mothers being victimized by trafficking, or were rescued along with their mothers from trafficking.

- **Mission:** RC is a dedicated Christian organization, working to prevent girls being trafficked for the purpose of sexual exploitation and bondage labor from Nepal. PRC rescues the victims and reintegrates them to the family or the society by empowering and equipping them, which enables survivors to live a new life with dignity.
- **Vision:** One Girl at a time; making a difference in the lives of those in despair; "Together we can make a difference"
- **Core Values:** Understanding, Service Excellence, Integrity, Accountability, and Stability.





Family Promise is coming to Calvary the week of February 14th, to be hosted by another church. AND, we will be hosting Family Promise at Calvary the following week, February 21st thru 28th.

There is a sign board up in the Fellowship Hall, to sign-up for duties: as usual, we need to have meal providers, evening hosts, and overnight hosts, along with set-up crew, and take-down crew on the last Sunday of their stay!

You at Calvary are such a blessing to these families that are struggling—and you make it possible for them to get on their own feet and be self-sufficient. And that Christian kindness will probably not be forgotten!
