Leaving a Great Heirloom

What is the greatest thing you have ever inherited? That piece of heirloom furniture which holds the prize position in your living room; that money that you used for the down payment on your first home; that simple dime-store trinket that reminds you of your grandmother; the photo albums that tell the story of your family through the generations? Inheritance can take countless forms. What will be the greatest gift that you will pass on you your children and grandchildren? What gifts will you share that will bless the people who are special to you long after your death?

As a five year old I received a simple pocket knife from my great grandfather when he died. It had genuine Bakelite-mother-of-pearl on the handle. It was called the "Fisher King" and for years it was my prized possession. At some point when I was in middle school I lost that knife and I was heartbroken. I still wish I had it. Not because it was valuable monetarily, but because it represented Great Grandpa Dennis a man who made a big impression on me in the first five years of my life. That was a wonderful inheritance.





Ephesians 1:11-17(excerpts) ¹¹In [Jesus] we have obtained an inheritance... ¹⁷a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, ¹⁸ having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints...

Having taken a look at the Greek, I might paraphrase this in the following way: Because of Jesus, you have inherited the ability to have a relationship with God and the ability to have your life flooded with the light of God in such a way that you are able to see clearly how much God loves you. It is an inheritance that has been passed to you through the Christians that have gone before you.



Paul understands that our trust in God, our saving faith, always comes to us through the testimony of others. When writing to Timothy, Paul explains that Timothy's saving faith had been passed down to him from his grandmother to his mother and finally to him. Given the time this letter was written Timothy may have been one of the very first 3rd generation Christians. His grandmother likely inherited her faith directly from Jesus or the Apostles. (2 Timothy 1: 4-9) The faith that Timothy inherited is the very same treasure which has been passed now to us, an heirloom which is in reality older than time itself.

Faith is a family heirloom a gift we are called to pass on which is of greater value than any other treasure. It is a treasure we are called to pass on from one generation to the next but unfortunately it is not as simple to pass on as other heirlooms. We can't simply include a line in our will that says, "to my daughters Linnea, Sonja, and Mira— I leave my trust in Jesus Christ." Passing on faith requires intentional work. It requires living out our faith in a way that the ones we love can see us using it, praying with them, worshiping with them, talking about God together. It takes work. Passing on faith is far-and-away the greatest gift we

can give to the people who are important to us. It is worth the work, but more than that as we invest in intentionally living out our faith alongside those we love, we find that our faith will grow and we give an incredible gift to ourselves as well.

I have regularly heard people tell me that they fear their adult children have walked away from the faith, or that it is too late to help our children grow in their faith, they have to figure it out on their own now. That simply isn't true. It is never too late to reinstitute an old tradition. Tell your children you miss spending time with them. Maybe when you were a child every Sunday your family went to church and then went to lunch at Grandma's house. Maybe you could reinstitute that tradition once a month in your family. Invite your children and grandchildren to join you for church and then treat them to lunch or make them soup or all watch the Seahawks together. Make the tradition your own, but if you are brave enough to have the con-



versation with your adult children, bold enough to tell them that this is something that is important to you, they will listen, and probably they will listen better than they did as teens. Your children love you, and when they know something is important to you it will be important to them.

We are called to be missionaries first and foremost in our own families; to share our faith gently, lovingly, and persistently. You are a blessing to your family and the heirloom of faith is the greatest blessing you can pass on.

News from Peace Rehabilitation Center in Nepal.

Calvary supports Peace Rehabilitation Center through benevolence giving, and also in our prayers. To learn more, talk to Cory English, Dennis Wilson, Kathy Darrar, Audrey McGrath, or Pastor Matt. You can find out more by visiting the webpage, www.peacerehab.org. Psalm 106:10 "He saved them from the hand of the foe; from the hand of the enemy he **redeemed** them."

Programs that your donations support include the following:

Non-formal education (NFE) classes:

There are several NFE classes running in areas where skill development and income generation programs are running. These classes help educate the girls and women in high risk areas on reproductive health, HIV/AIDS and STDs, nutrition, and children. Currently, there are two classes running in Butwal where 40 women and girls are taking part of the program.

Rehabilitation center:

The Kathmandu rehabilitation home offers short term or long term care in a safe and loving Christian environment. At risk or trafficked victims are provided with health care services, counseling, and formal or non-formal education. This enables the girls to recover and prepare to be reintegrated into society with skills that empower them for their future. Currently there are 15 girls living in the home, however, this number will never be fixed.

Child care program:

Often when trafficked women are rescued, they come with children. These children are considered at risk without care from PRC. Since its foundation, PRC has looked after the children in the same shelter where those HIV positive patients and returnees are living. We feel strongly that there needs to be a separate home where the neediest can live.

Border monitoring program:

Currently, PRC has two border monitoring booths. One is in the southern part of Nepal, which is in partnership with SERVE-Nepal and the other is in Mahendranagar, on the southwestern border. These two sites have proved vital in the rescuing of girls before they are trafficked into India. PRC would like to open border patrol stations along all the major border cities of Nepal.

Pokhara Orphans Home:

There is a great need for loving homes for the many orphaned children of Nepal. Recognizing this need, PRC opened a home specifically for orphans ten years ago. It is located in the Pokhara countryside and currently has 15 children. We are proud to report that all are in school and doing quite well.

These are badly needed programs, and your generous giving can prevent more of the abuses that place these young ladies' lives in jeopardy, as well as helping heal and provide a living for themselves.

- Bring: New or gently-used twin sheet sets or twin sized blankets and comforters will be collected as part of a special offering.

One of the Erickson girls' favorite things about being a part of Calvary is that they get to help host with **Family Promise**. Whenever they get the opportunity Pastor Matt and the entire Erickson Family has relished the chance to eat dinner along side, enjoy deep conversations with and of course play with families that are experiencing transformation as their lives move from homelessness to sustainability.

As a host family the Ericksons are responsible primarily for helping doors get unlocked and locked, helping with some basic serving and clean-up, and just being present with the gift of hospitality. For adults the hardest part is spending the night sleeping at the church on "roll-away" cots but of course for kids this is just part of the adventure and it feels like a sleep-over. Each guest family and the hosts get their own room to sleep in but there is something deeply spiritual about sharing the same sleeping arrangements with a family that is homeless, even for just one night. It is an act of solidarity and act of humility, an opportunity to grow.

Guest families that are enrolled in the Family Promise program usually spend between 12 and 28 weeks being coached, trained, supported and loved as they gather all the skills and resources necessary to

transition to permanent housing and sustainable living. In the meantime they stay at churches throughout Kootenai County, staying with each congregation for a week at a time. There are no shelters, outside of Family Promise, available in the inland northwest that allow families to stay together as they transition away from homelessness. Without family promise adult men, teen boys, and women and young children all have to be housed separately.

Over the next year Calvary has decided to deepen our commitment to Family Promise as we work to live out our mission, "to tell of Christ's love as we care for all people and creation." Between now and the end of 2016 we will host Family Promise Guests at Calvary 4 times. We will provide them with rooms to sleep in, meals to eat, bedding for the cots, and of course hospitality. As we increase our support for this amazing ministry we need your help.

On November 15th you will have the opportunity to:

1. Bring a set of new or gently-used twin sheets (flat sheet, fitted sheet, & pillow case) that we can use repeatedly at Calvary every time we host Family Promise.

2. Bring a new or gently used twin sized comforter that we can use repeatedly at Calvary every time we host Family Promise.

3. Get trained to become a Family Promise host by attending the training session from 10:30 to 12:00 on November 15th. (Childcare will be available during this entire time.)

4. Sign up to be an Evening Host, Overnight Host, Meal Provider, Set-Up Crew, or Take-Down Crew volunteer during one of the four weeks that we hosting guests over the next 14 months.

5. Give a special financial gift to help us with some of the other costs associated with preparing to host families regularly in our building.
